Progress continues to be made on the building of our new **Professor Stephen Hawking Neuro Centre** for people with acquired brain injuries and neurological conditions in Ipswich, which is set to open next year.

Plans have recently been submitted to Ipswich Borough Council and you can see the latest architect's image on the right.

The new build will consist of a rehabilitation hub and 24 homes in two bungalows on Ravenswood Estate, on the edge of Ipswich.



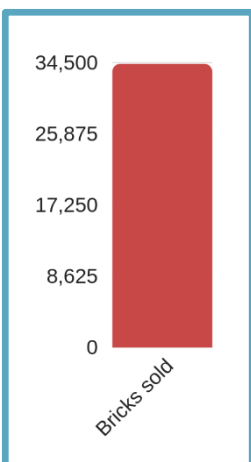
It will replace our current hub on Ransomes Europark and cost in the region of £5 million.

Neuro Conference - Wednesday 16 October

We are delighted to announce that **television and radio broadcaster Chris Tarrant** will be a keynote speaker at our fifth annual **Neuro Conference on Wednesday 16 October** at Wherstead Park in Ipswich.

Chris is known for hosting the world's most successful quiz show *Who Wants to be a Millionaire?* on ITV from 1998-2014, as well as presenting on Capital Radio's early-morning show from 1984-2004.

His most recent work has seen him travel the world filming *Chris Tarrant: Extreme Railways* since 2012, and it was whilst travelling back from Bangkok in March 2012 when **Chris suffered a stroke** and lost the use of his arms and legs, as he feared he was going to die.

A blood clot was removed from Chris's left leg, which had caused a temporary loss of blood to his brain, and he has since made a good recovery after regaining his speech and movement.

The 72-year-old, who was awarded an OBE from the Queen in 2004 for services to broadcasting and charity, will talk to delegates about his experience of being a stroke survivor and the adjustments he has made in his life and his new-found outlook.

Do you know about our Dementia groups?



Did you know we provide two very popular monthly groups in Ipswich and Martlesham for people suffering with dementia?

The service is social support groups with stimulating and engaging activities (such as indoor curling – see left), as well as a fish and chips lunch and refreshments.

We meet on the **second Friday of the month (12 April)** at **St Augustine's Church in Bucklesham Road, Ipswich**, and on the **fourth Thursday of the month (25 April)** at **St Michael's Church Centre in The Drift, Martlesham**.

Both open from 11.45am – 3.15pm. It costs just £6 and the person with dementia must be accompanied by a carer.

We are always in need of volunteers to help in the kitchen, with preparation, tidying away and engaging with clients in discussion and activities.
