WORKSHOP FOR EMPLOYERS

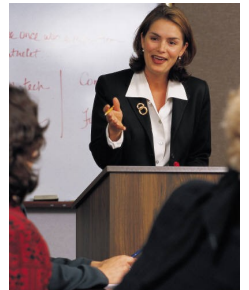

It is now 5 months since Headway Ipswich and East Suffolk and West Suffolk Headway merged to become Headway Suffolk.



The rationale for this was to make us a stronger and more efficient organisation. We are already seeing the benefits of this.

During this time we have started the satellite at Haverhill - the first of many satellites we hope to open in the coming years.

We held a very successful

launch event at Haughley Barns which many of you attended.

We continue to run 2 excellent neuro hubs, at Ipswich and Bury St Edmunds where clients can take part in a range of activities that will help with their recovery or slow down their condition.

As well as having rehabilitation we hope clients will make new friends and have fun. It also gives family carers respite.

Our community support across the county is growing rapidly. We offer a service that the clients themselves design.

It could be helping with personal care or taking part in an activity of their choice.

We offer a 24-7 service. All of our staff are trained to understand neurological conditions and to give the support and care our clients need and deserve.

Our Brainy dog scheme is going well. We train dogs to become well trained pets and friends to people with a neurological condition. We are also able to visit people in their homes with a Brainy dog.

We continue to offer physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech and language therapy and counselling at the Ipswich hub. The counsellor can also see family members. We are trying to secure funding to offer therapy from the Bury St Edmunds hub too.

Our very popular understanding Brain injury course is being held again in September. We are taking bookings for people to attend in 2015.

OUTREACH IN HAVERHILL

Our satellite service in Haverhill will expand to a full day every Wednesday from September 3.

We opened half a day a week from June in the Burton Centre in Camps Road after forming a partnership with St Nicholas Hospice.

Haverhill was urgently identified as a priority as clients struggled with fatigue or transport cost of the 40 mile round trip to our hub in Bury St Edmunds.

Clients are engaged in rehabilitation activities to improve their independence and confidence.
